### WPSO Board of Directors Election June 22 - Annual Meeting

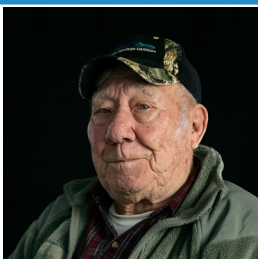

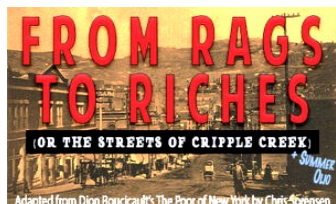

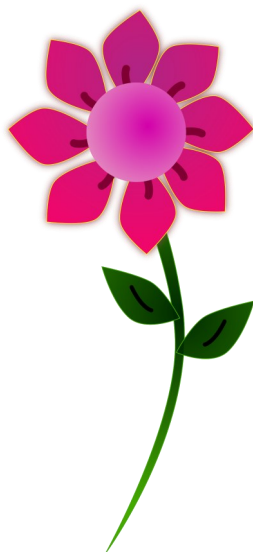
