Between Teller Coalition committing to be the food transporter, volunteers to cook and serve Tuesday lunches not covered by Potluck and Catered Lunch, and the Transition program who cook and serve the Friday lunches the challenge has been met. The quick response resulted in the Senior Center's ability to continue the lunch service totally uninterrupted. It is a testament to the dedication of our organization to serving the seniors of Teller County. Congratulations to all!


