Senior Center Limited Activities Protocols

The Senior Center has reopened for activities with protocols in place to protect the health of our members. The number of individuals in the center at any one time is restricted to 20 people. All individuals are checked in at the front desk noting date, time and activity so folks can be notified if it is found there has been an exposure to Covid. Temperatures will be taken and anyone with a temperature of 100 or greater will be asked to leave. Masks are required for anyone entering the center.

After each activity any supplies used as well as the tables and chairs will be sanitized. Door knobs and other surfaces touched during the open hours will be sanitized frequently though out each day.

Co-operation is requested by all who come into the center. It is hoped that additional activities can be added as we become comfortable that these practices are accepted by our membership.

Leave the Senior Center at 10am return by 1:00pm

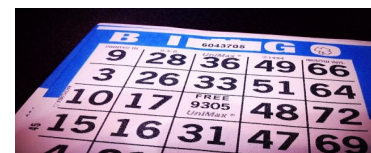
