Deficit for 2015 was \$2,452.03.

We foresee a deficit for this year of approximately \$2,500.

Dues went up by \$10 for 2016, for an additional \$1,750 in income. Our regular Monday evening building tenant moved last year. Income for 2015 special events includes sponsorships. We had no sponsors for this year's Wild West Silent Auction. Our grant is not available again until 2018.

Included in cash donations for 2016 will be a \$900 donation from Cruise Above the Clouds Car Show. Yea!!!

We have submitted a Letter of Intent to the Myron Stratton Home and the Woodland Park (City) Community Investment Fund. Both of these, if funded, will come after the end of the year. We will also be sending out a limited solicitation mailing this year. Charitable organizations across the board, receive about 3/4 of their income from direct donations, and we hope to start building a donor base with this mailing.

Your donations matter, whether a cash donation in the "big jar", a donation for merchandise, for coffee, for Bridge, for copies, whatever the reason, they all help.

Prior to the hiring of the first Activities Coordinator, the Club ran on Volunteer effort alone. Returning to that method of operating would save the club the largest chunk of change. Is there someone out there who would like to become the Volunteer Activities Coordinator? All volunteers, are of course, welcomed and appreciated, but this one would get the Club back on track to investing for a rainy day!
