Attention all members and supporters of the Woodland Park Senior Organization, did you know that there is an easy way for you to help raise funds for the organization with the City Market Community Rewards Program? All you have to do is shop at City Market and swipe your Value Card! - 3) If you are not internet savvy and need help with registration ask a friend to help.
- 4) For those that need more help you can come by the office M-F between 9am to 1pm and we will walk you through the process and register you on our office computer. You would just need to make an appointment with the front desk.
