On the agenda will be forming a committee to start planning for the reopening of the Senior Center. The Teller County Public Health advises that we wait until we can be assured that our population is safe in public gatherings. Cases in Teller County are low but new cases are still popping up.

We will stay closed at least until the Silver Key frozen meals transition back to our regular hot lunch program. Until then we will continue with the frozen lunch program which is open to anyone 60 or older regardless of financial need. Call the center by Tuesday at 1:00pm to make your reservation.

Please call the center to get your name on the list for any of these activities. We can easily set up ZOOM meetings. We do have a group logging on for Bingo each week. Let's see if we can't get 3 virtual events each week throughout the remaining "Safe at Home" time.




