
AND NOW, A WORD FROM OUR TREASURER

The Club's fiscal year was half over as of 30 June so it's time for a financial update. We continue to do much better than last year. June showed a profit of \$732. Our operating funds show a \$1345 loss for the year so far, BUT this time last year we had a \$4445 operating loss AND had sold \$4000 of securities to pay the expenses. We have sold no securities this year and it's still looking like we won't need to. I attribute our better financial position to dues, donations of lunch food and cash, and event sponsorships. Although the board of directors voted to increase dues in both 2016 and 2017, I'll ask the board to re-evaluate the need for a 2017 increase this fall. It may not be necessary. Now wouldn't that be nice?


MONTHLY MUSIC SERIES COMING TO WOODLAND PARK SENIOR CENTER




