## 25th CRUISE ABOVE THE CLOUDS CAR SHOW

The Cruise Above the Clouds Car Show was organized as a Chamber of Commerce event in Woodland Park in 1991. At the first show only five cars were entered. When the Chamber of Commerce withdrew from sponsoring the Cruise Above the Clouds Car Show in 1998, the Above the Clouds Cruisers Car Club made a commitment to continue it. Held on the second Saturday each September, the Car Show has grown to a two-day show with 200 to 250 cars participating, (240 cars have already pre-registered this year) and hundreds of spectators attending.

This year's show will again feature Dennis Gage of My Classic Car.

FATHER UNKNOWN

A gripping family mystery, with roots at the Swiss Chalet Restaurant in Woodland Park is solved in a new film that will be screening on Saturday, September 17th at Gold Hill Theaters. Featuring former Woodland Park resident, Urban Quint, and his brave attempt to solve the mystery of his origins by returning to the orphanage in Switzerland where he lived as a child. Captured by Urban's son on a camera phone as it happened, Father Unknown is the true story of a man's struggle to face the emptiness he carries inside. Disconnected from the people closest to him and haunted by the secrecy in his family, he records his desperate search for connection on a journey with the father he's never truly known.

Father Unknown has screened for audiences at film festivals and select cities across the country including Martha's Vineyard, San Francisco,

Denver, Omaha and Scottsdale. The film has won multiple awards including The Audience Choice Award at the Lifetree Film Festival in Loveland. The film's director and subject will appear in person after the film.

This is the incredible true story that led to my grandparents coming to America and eventually building the Swiss Chalet Restaurant. "We're excited to bring this powerful story home to Woodland Park," said the film's director, David Quint. David, a Denver-based filmmaker and his father Urban, will host an audience conversation about their life-changing journey and the history behind the Swiss Chalet following the screening.
