Board of Directors Update

Reopening the Senior Center: The reopening committee has submitted guidelines to the county health department and received some suggested modifications to

the plan. They will now seek input from the City of Woodland Park. We will not consider reopening the center until Silver Key resumes the hot meal program.

Frozen Meals: These meals are still available for pick-up or delivery on each Monday. They are available to any senior at a suggested donation of \$11.25 for 5 meals. Reservations need to be made no later than 12 o'clock on each Wednesday. If you know of someone who could benefit from this program please encourage them to contact the Senior Center at (719) 687-3877.


